for early career female or gender diverse researchers in mathematics & physics

Applications open 6 July and close 6 August.

The Mentoring and Guidance in Careers Workshop (MAGIC2018) is an opportunity to explore the many facets of forging a career in academic, government or industry settings, and to discuss how to create building blocks for success and resilience. Participation is limited to a maximum of 35 early career researchers who will have the opportunity to develop a variety of skills; and to create a support network that will allow them to forge a successful career in science.

The MAGIC program involves actively interacting with your fellow participants and seeking potential collaborations. Applicants should have an ongoing commitment to making a positive contribution not only to their research but also to the broader scientific community.

To be eligible to attend MAGIC you should:

- be an early career researcher 0-7 years post PhD (excluding career interruptions)
- be female or of diverse gender identity
- have a PhD in mathematical or physical sciences (i.e. the disciplines of mathematics, physics and cognate disciplines)
- currently be based in Australia
